To present all of your amazing photography, each student will create a new Photo Blog. From here your photos can be shown, commented on and shared. Please follow these steps carefully and even after the end of the Trimester you'll have your very own website from which to create, utilize and enjoy!

Go to www.weebly.com and on the left side of the screen add your name, email
and password. It is expected to use your DC Gmail account for this! It's the only
real email that you'd have access to in school.
You are to then start a <b>BLOG</b> site!
Select a theme for your blog. Keep in mind a few things: some of the designs
offer various colors to choose from, try not to choose one that will take away
from your photography, select a theme that best fits who YOU are. Personality
creates interest! Also understand that this theme can be changed as many times
as you wish.
What is the name of your blog going to be? Choose the top option on the screen
– it will add ".weebly.com" to the end of your domain name. Choose something
easy to remember, personal and reflects that this is a photo blog.
<ul> <li>Once finished PLEASE write down your domain name and your password</li> </ul>
on the Master List that is with the Instructor!! This list of website names
will be distributed to everyone in the class (NOT the passwords).
On the right side of the Blog Builder you will find "Author" and a small
description. Add your name, or a handle to be identified with. Write in a quick
little blurb about yourself. PLEASE leave out details that are too personal as this is
a public site. Keep it short and sweet.
Find <b>BLOG SETTINGS</b> . In the new list you have two changes to make:
<ul> <li>Make sure your email is added to be notified of new comments to your</li> </ul>
posts
<ul> <li>Change the date/time to US CENTRAL (the actual format is up to you).</li> </ul>
Click SAVE!
At the top of the screen click on <b>PAGES</b> . On the left side you will see the three
pages available (BLOG, ABOUT, CONTACT). You will need to delete the CONTACT
PAGE!! It's unnecessary for this class
